It brought much glory and helped bind together the peoples of the British Isles in a united kingdom of shared endeavour, whose legacy continues to this day. But the British empire came at a price and lasted barely two hundred years. This is specifically a book about England. I regard Wales, Scotland and Ireland as countries with their own histories. They have spent less than half their existence as components of a union of Great Britain and Ireland, an embrace that tends to subordinate them in conventional histories of Britain.
