The Telecommunications and Information Infrastructure Assistance Program (later renamed Technology Opportunities Program (TOP)) was a program, administered by NTIA, that helped get new telecommunications and information technologies to underserved communities. It provides matching grants to schools, clinics, and other nonprofit and governmental entities using these technologies to spur community development. As of 2004, grant funds were no longer available under TOP. The National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) is an agency of the United States Department of Commerce that serves as the President's principal adviser on telecommunications policies pertaining to the United States' economic and technological advancement and to regulation of the telecommunications industry. Among its stated goals are: Working to ensure that all Americans have affordable phone and cable TV service.
