The Prussian Reform Movement was a series of constitutional, administrative, social and economic reforms early in the nineteenth-century Kingdom of Prussia. They are sometimes known as the Stein-Hardenberg Reforms, for Karl Freiherr vom Stein and Karl August von Hardenberg, their main initiators. Before the Second World War, German historians, such as Heinrich von Treitschke, saw the reforms as the first steps towards the unification of Germany and the foundation of the German Empire.[1]. The reforms were a reaction to the defeat of the Prussians by Napoleon I at Jena-Auerstedt in 1806, leading Administrative, social, and military reforms were clearly overdue, and the king's chief minister, Karl Stein, seized the opportunity to introduce them. His basic idea was to evoke a positive consciousness of solidarity with the state by allowing the citizens to take a more active part in public affairs. This idea underlay the emancipation of the serfs (begun in 1807), the measures for local self-government, and the reshaping of the central government. Hardenberg adroitly steered Prussia through the difficulties of 1812, when Prussia and Austria, in enforced alliance with France, participated in Napoleon's attack on Russia. Napoleon's retreat from Moscow was the signal for a rising against the French. : "The King of Prussia acts out of the double influence of vague alarm and religious feeling." The day before, the "Reform" even admitted that "Apart from an ignorant and scandalous mixing of the freed criminals and needy workers, we find in this document the presentiment, the instinct, of the great social reforms of civil society which the situation of Europe necessitates everywhere." The "Reform" would not be wrong, in their understanding of the King, if next to the official ideas of the document they also understand the entirety of the German situation. Military reforms included universal conscription, introduced for all social classes on 1 January 1874.[23] Prior to the new regulation, as of 1861, conscription was compulsorily enforced only for the peasantry. After Alexander II became Emperor of Russia and King of Poland in 1855, he substantially relaxed the strict and repressive regime that had been imposed on Congress Poland after the November Uprising of 1830-1831.[38][39].
