The whole Old Testament is written in classical Hebrew, except some brief portions which are in the Aramaic language (Ezra 4.8-6.18 and 7.12-26, Jeremiah 10.11, Daniel 2.4-7.28), a sister language which became the lingua franca of the Semitic world. The earliest surviving form of the Hebrew text is perhaps that found in the Samaritan Pentateuch (Genesis-Deuteronomy). The Old Testament has left an enormous legacy in the history of ideas, which naturally leads to connections in theology and philosophy. This introduction to the Old Testament as literature will therefore trace the single most important contribution of the Old Testament -that of monotheism -as a theme throughout this book.
