The commissionâ€™s role is to receive, review, and make final decisions on petitions for: Incorporation of municipalities. Reclassification of municipalities. Furthermore the role of local government is seen as a purchaser but not necessarily a provider of local services and to serve as a catalyst in network governance at the local level for developing social capital and improving economic and social outcomes. It also traces the historical evolution of the role of local government in local governance and presents a stylized view oif alternative models of local governance and central-local relations as practiced in the world.
