My children knew dozens of Chinese characters before starting Sagebooks and thus felt confident with the initial levels. Sagebooks are not designed for babies and young toddlers who would benefit from stories with realistic images rather than cartoons. How do young learners learn? According to Piaget (1970), children are active learners and thinkers, and as well as they learn through social interaction. Young learners will learn best if the people involved in the teaching process facilitate the learning and take into account the way young learners learn into the teaching practices. Piaget (1967 cited in McCloskey, 2002), suggested that children developed through specific stages, they are: Sensory-Motor Stage (from 0-2 years) in which children seems to learn through physical interaction with the world around them.
